1. Please state specific goals for this grant or the grant period. Overarching Goals for the QFI Grant:

- Build sequential learning opportunities K-12, so that students develop high levels of proficiency, ideally reaching the Seal of Biliteracy by high school.
- Provide opportunities for native or heritage Arabic speakers to maintain and strengthen their proficiency levels, especially in reading and writing. Enhance their feelings of comfort, acceptance and joy at being in our schools.
- Build interest in and understanding of Arabic language and culture across our school community and especially in those with Arabic programs.
- Build the skills of our Arabic teachers to provide engaging, proficiency-based instructions and build programs through advocacy, events, and student success.

During the 2025-26 school year, the Arabic program will:

- Continue to offer Arabic instruction in grades K-8 at Jepson. This position allows students to begin Arabic instruction earlier and continue into the existing FT 6-8 Arabic program. This will support student ability to reach higher levels of proficiency in this difficult language.
- Continue to offer Arabic instruction in grades K-4 at King Robinson. This position allows all students K-4 at King Robinson to receive world language instruction before grade 5 (others receive French), and supports the schools' schedule, and IB focus.
- Begin Arabic 6-8 Instruction at Clemente. This is a new part-time language for the school, helping to support the rising number of Arabic speakers, Afghani students (Pashto speakers with some Arabic experience), as well as expose other students in Arabic classes to a new language and culture. In addition, it replaces a general funds part-time position.
- Hold an Arabic-related student and/or Family Outreach events at Wilbur Cross, Hill Regional Career, Metropolitan Business Academy, Jepson, King Robinson, and Clemente to celebrate the language and culture citywide.
- Teachers act as a support and resource for Arabic-speaking students and families at all schools where Arabic is being taught.

During the 2024-25 year, the QFI grant funded the following:

- Engaged all students at Jepson in the learning of Arabic our first K-8 sequential program and ran a very successful Arabic Festival there.
- Engaged students at King Robinson in grades K-4 in the learning of Arabic and played a key role in International Night at the school.
- Supported a large Arabic Festival at Wilbur Cross High School.
- Supported an Arabic Staff Luncheon and an Arabic Class Luncheon at Hill Regional Career High School to build community among Arabic speaking and learning students, and staff.
- Supported a successful Arabic Festival for all students at Jepson.

In addition, via separate funding directly to teachers, QFI paid for two of our new full-time Arabic teachers at Metropolitan Business Academy and Hill Regional Career High school to attend the Alternate Route to Certification program so that they could successfully fill open positions at those schools.

3. How does this grant address School Reform goals?

Through this grant, students have the opportunity to begin language study in kindergarten at Jepson and King Robinson, thereby making it more likely that they attain Level IV and/or the Seal of Biliteracy in high school. At Clemente, there is a rising population of Arabic speakers and students from Afghanistan with some Arabic exposure and who are culturally closer to Arab culture. Having an Arabic teacher in these schools allows us to better engage families who speak Arabic there while offering another language choice to students. As a less-commonly taught language, Arabic is a unique language to have on high school transcripts, possibly

increasing students' college acceptance potential. It opens doors to careers and opportunities in our New Haven community and worldwide.

In addition, students who learn Arabic at Wilbur Cross, Hill Regional Career, FAME, Jepson, King Robinson, ESUMS, and Clemente will have the opportunity to attend the various Arabic Festivals and experience the food, dance, and culture of the Arabic-speaking world as they apply what they have learned in classes. These experiences build school <u>Culture and Climate</u> by increasing understanding of our Middle Eastern and Northern African students and our many newcomers from these regions.
